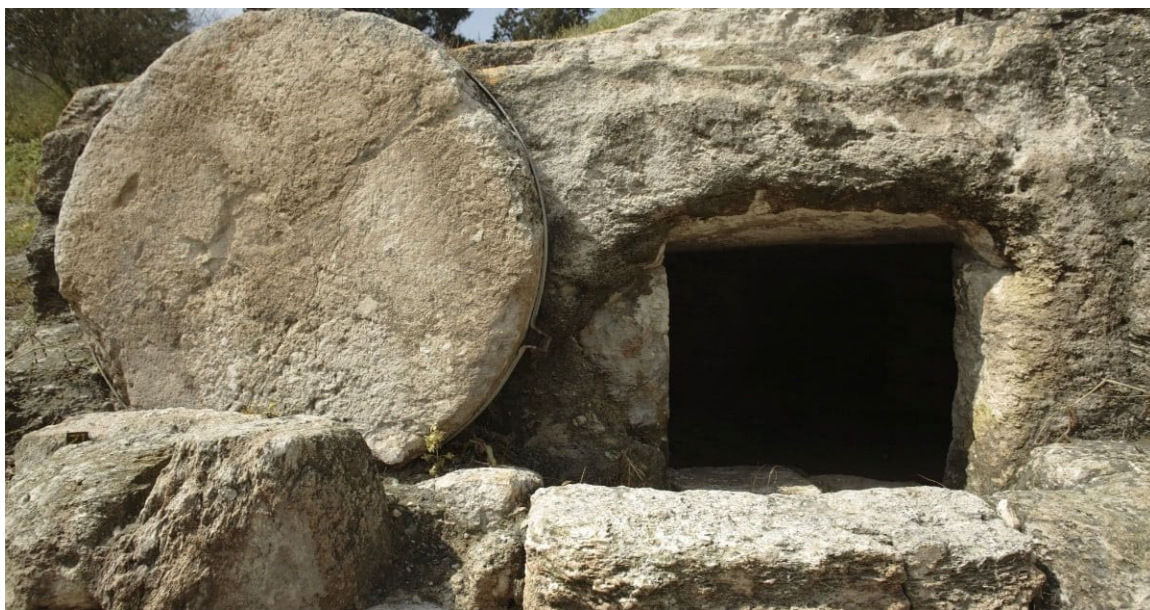

Leader: "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"

Leader: "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?"

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Heidelberg Catechism Question 43, 45

What further benefit do we receive from the sacrifice and death of Christ on the cross?

That by virtue thereof, our old man is crucified, dead and buried with him; that so the corrupt inclinations of the flesh may no more reign in us; but that we may offer ourselves unto him a sacrifice of thanksgiving.

What does the “resurrection” of Christ profit us?

First, by his resurrection he has overcome death, that he might make us partakers of that righteousness which he had purchased for us by his death; secondly, we are also by his power raised up to a new life; and lastly, the resurrection of Christ is a sure pledge of our blessed resurrection.
